L.D. Lockett House: Ready to play

The city has completed renovations at the L.D. Lockett House. One of the city's recreation facilities, L.D. Lockett has hosted almost 2,000 people in more than 390 classes during the past three years.

Major renovations began early this summer, including repainting of the buildings interior and exterior. Other enhancements include dance mirrors and rails, wall-to-wall hardwood floors, upgraded lighting, installation of a professional-quality audio system, refurbishment of the restroom facilities, and added security.

Popular programs such as adult and youth painting sessions, guitar lessons, and arts and crafts classes will continue at L.D. Lockett, but the renovations also pave the way for new programming. This fall, the Parks and Recreation Department will offer 24 additional programs at its various recreation venues--many of them at the L.D. Lockett House.

For the first time, the city will be offering tap dance—a new class made possible by the freshly installed wood floors at L.D. Lockett. Examples of other classes include:

- Sign, Say & Play—an innovative sign language program geared to infants.
- Parent Workshop for Baby Sign Language
- Team Cheer—a fun-filled class that

teaches cheering techniques and programs to youths at all experience levels.

- Dance Night Out - an evening of dance, fun and games, and movies for ages 5-12.
- Help Me! I want to Be Healthy—a program dedicated to helping people make simple, constructive lifestyle changes that pay off in major health improvements.
- Weight Loss for Real People
- Latin Dance
- Country/Western Dance

The renovations at the L.D. Lockett House and the resulting programming that can be offered there are provided to enrich the lives and lifestyles of Colleyville residents.

New Refuse Guidelines



The city's new refuse collection contract takes effect Sept. 1. IESI, the city's refuse/recycling provider for the past five years, will continue to provide the service.

The information provided below outlines the parameters of the city's refuse service:

- The new rate is \$10.05 per month for residential service—an increase of \$1.80. The new rate remains one of the lowest in the D/FW area. Customers will see the new rate reflected on the September billing statements.
- Customers will continue to have unlimited pick-up of normal household trash and yard waste bags.
- Up to four tied bundles of brush or fencing are allowed for each pick-up.
- Trash collection days will remain Mondays and Thursdays, including holidays, with the exception of Christmas Day.
- Customers are allowed four large-item pick-ups (up to four cubic yards) throughout the year. Additional large-item pick-ups will be billed at \$9 per cubic yard, with a \$48 minimum.
- Arrangements for the collection of renovation debris or other items that are beyond the norm for residential trash collection may be made through IESI for a fee. These items require special equipment and, without special arrangements, can slow service for others.
