



Junked Vehicles

Code of City Ordinances: Chapter 42, Article II, Nuisances

It shall be unlawful for any owner or occupant who occupies or controls any property or portion thereof, within the corporate city limits of Colleyville, to permit or allow the placement or storage of a junked vehicle or junked vehicle part(s) as defined in this ordinance on the aforementioned property.

Code of City Ordinances: Chapter 42, Section 42-30, Junked Vehicles. Chapter 42, Section 42-30(a), Definition. The definition of a junked vehicle is as follows:

1. A motor vehicle that is inoperative; and;
2. That does not have lawfully affixed to it either an unexpired license plate or a valid motor vehicle safety inspection certificate; that is wrecked, dismantled, partially dismantled or discarded; or that remains inoperative for a continuous period of more than 45 days.

Chapter 42, Section 42-30(b)(1).

Public nuisance: A junked vehicle or vehicle part(s) that is located in a place where it is visible from a public place or public right-of-way is detrimental to the safety and welfare of the general public; tends to reduce the value of private property; invites vandalism; creates fire hazards; constitutes an unattractive nuisance, creating a hazard to the economic welfare of the city by producing urban blight adverse to the maintenance and continued development of the city and is hereby declared to be a public nuisance.





It is not considered a public nuisance to maintain a vehicle or a vehicle part(s) that is completely enclosed within a building in a lawful manner where it is not visible from the street, public or private property; a vehicle or vehicle part(s) that is stored or parked in a lawful manner on private property in connection with the business of a licensed, operable or inoperable antique or special interest vehicle stored by a collector in compliance with all city ordinances.

Chapter 42, Section 42-31(a) Definition of terms.

Parkway; means the portion of any street between the roadway and the private property line.

To avoid the unsightly appearance of junked and abandoned vehicles in residential districts, no vehicles may be parked or stored on a residential premise where visible to any adjacent residential use, unless a current state vehicle inspection sticker is displayed thereon.
