RESPONSE ACTIVITIES

Tarrant County conducted ground spraying in unincorporated Tarrant County:

June 27, 2013

- portions of MAPSCO 86 [E,J,F,K] southwest Tarrant County
- portions of MAPSCO 122 [P,Q,T,U] southeast Tarrant County

June 29, 2013

- portions of MAPSCO 18 M&R and 19 J&N
- portions of MAPSCO 31 D&H, 32 A&E and 18 W

CITY OF KELLER PUTTING SB186 INTO ACTION

- Eliminating potential mosquito breeding sites in locations with abandoned and unmaintained swimming pools
- Using larvicides at the identified site(s)
- Leaving a notice of treatment

CITY OF FORT WORTH ACTIONS FOLLOWING CONFIRMED WEST NILE CASE (WNF)

- Performed an environmental evaluation of the area
- Simultaneously set out additional mosquito traps to sample the mosquitoes in the immediate area
- Additional focus in the area of the human case to educate citizens regarding WNV-prevention measures

MOSQUITO SAMPLING

On 6/25/2013 and 6/26/2013 – 120 mosquito pools were submitted to the laboratory. All pools were tested for WNV and SLE.

Laboratory Results:

- One sample tested **positive** for WNV (City of Grapevine)
- All samples tested **negative** for SLE.

On 6/27/2013 –

39 mosquito pools were submitted to the laboratory. All pools were tested for WNV and SLE.

Laboratory Results:

- All samples tested **negative** for WNV.
- All samples tested **negative** for SLE.

HUMAN CASE DATA – TARRANT COUNTY

One human case for 2013 – Fort Worth resident, in her 40s, milder form of West Nile virus, commonly called West Nile Fever
